

2018 / 19 Pupil Premium Proposed Expenditure



NJS is innovative and flexible in its use of Pupil Premium funding and is committed to accelerating progress and raising attainment and aspirations for all learners. Funding is allocated to schools according to the number of pupils on roll who are:

- On Free School Meals (FSM)
- Looked After Children (LAC), including adopted children and those on Residence or Special Guardianship Orders
- Pupils from Armed Service families

In line with a significant fall in numbers eligible in 2018/19, we anticipate receipt of approximately **£78,680** in this academic year. Resources are very limited and not all children from these three categories will receive intervention at any one time. We constantly track, target and monitor the needs, well-being and academic progress of all children and priority for intervention will be given to individual or wider groups of children deemed to be at risk of falling behind their peers or where learning progress is below age related expectation.

From time to time, some children may be deemed vulnerable or in challenging circumstances and pupil premium resources may be utilised to support those children and their families in order to bring about raised self-esteem and learning confidence.

During the 2018/19 academic year, funding will continue to contribute towards a variety of academic support programmes and will provide the opportunity for all children to participate in a range of extra-curricular enrichment activities:

Learning mentor social, emotional mental health and wellbeing, academic (including structured Project Code X and Phonics reading interventions for reluctant readers) and other pastoral support programmes.	34,631
Teaching Team individual and small group intervention support for maths and literacy, including:- Phonics, Nessy, Maths, Reading, Precision Teaching, Emotional Literacy, Circle of Friends, Life Skills, I am Unique, Nothing, Lego Therapy, Sensory Circuits and other personalised transitional programmes.	52,077
Staff Training and Development (targeted support and intervention in order to achieve accelerated reading, writing and maths progress – including monitoring and data analysis by Assessment, Subject and Inclusion Leaders to ensure high impact provision)	£3,960
Children's University Enrichment Workshops and Extended Schools Provision (access to a rich and varied range of activities:- Lets Get Cooking, Dance, Football, Art, Cricket, Taekwondo, Robotics, Rugby, Athletics, Netball, Bikeability – sustaining attendance levels at above national average and raising aspirations and self-esteem.	£3,150

Impact Evaluation 2017/18

The Inclusion Leader & Leadership Team regularly monitor and evaluate the allocation of resources and provision with regard to impact on progress and attainment as well as on personal development, behaviour and emotional health and wellbeing for all pupils.

In 2017/18 (up to March 2018), attendance levels were above national average at 96.7% for all children and just below national average at 94.7% for Pupil Premium children. A focus on creative and engaging curriculum content, quality-first teaching, bespoke targeted interventions and access to a wide range of exciting extra-curricular enrichment activities continues to develop positive learning attitudes and confidence whilst impacting encouragingly on attendance for all children.
